Newsbrief

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman called upon police personnel to try their best to ensure peace and security of the country's people. The Prime Minister also said that crime control will become easier if trust is built between the police and people. The Prime Minister made the call while addressing the inaugural ceremony of the Police Week- 2026 at the Rajarbagh Police Lines ground in the capital yesterday. The Prime Minister said, the present government, formed with the people's verdict after a bloody student-people mass uprising in 2024 as a continuation of more than one and a half decades of movement and struggle against fascism, reflects the aspirations of the country's freedom-loving and democracy-seeking people.

Finance Minister Amir Khosru Mahmud Chowdhury said, Bangladesh's economy has to become more participatory and inclusive so that every citizen can take part in economic activities and share the benefits of development, stressing that cooperation from all stakeholders is essential to take the 'Bangladesh story' to the global arena. The Minister said this while addressing the 'Stepping Forward' the inauguration of RAISE-2 project held at PKSF auditorium in the capital yesterday.

Home Minister Salahuddin Ahmed said, the government will fulfill the rationale demands of police considering the country's financial capacity and resources, with the aim of building a more modern and public welfare-oriented police force. The Minister made the remarks while speaking at the 'Prime Minister's Special Welfare Meeting' organized marking Police Week-2026 at Rajarbagh Police Auditorium in the capital yesterday.

Women and Children Affairs Minister Abu Zafar Md. Zahid Hossain said, a mother is a child's first shelter, first teacher and lifelong guide as her selfless love, sacrifice and silent service can never truly be repaid through gratitude alone. The Minister told an event marking Mother's Day at Raowa Convention Centre in the capital's Mohakhali yesterday. Universal Medical College Hospital organized the proud mothers honoring event titled 'Gorbini Maa-2026'.

Land Minister Mizanur Rahman Minu said, no nation can become great without honoring its distinguished people, whose knowledge and contributions have benefited the country in many ways, for which the nation will remain forever grateful. The Minister made the remarks while speaking at a seminar and reception for senior engineers held at the conference room of Rajshahi University of Engineering and Technology on Saturday.

Information and Broadcasting Minister Zahir Uddin Swapon said, in the current era of artificial intelligence and technology, it is not enough to make the future generation only technically skilled, rather they should be educated in moral education along with digital literacy. The Minister made the remarks while speaking at a national seminar titled 'Role of Moral Education in Implementing the Philosophy of 'Bangladesh Comes First'. Bangladesh Student Welfare Trust arranged the seminar at Daffodil Tower Auditorium in the capital yesterday.

Water Resources Minister Shahiduddin Chowdhury Anee said, Corrosion-resistant and climate-resilient coastal infrastructure is crucial for the long-term security and economic development of Bangladesh. The Minister told a seminar titled 'Corrosion-Resistant Coastal Infrastructure in Bangladesh and Unveiling of Project Management Training Manual and Certificate Awarding' held at Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh auditorium in the capital yesterday.

Chattogram Hill Tracts Affairs (CHT) Minister Dipen Dewan said that the CHT region is a highly promising region for sports. The Minister said these while addressing the prize-distribution ceremony of the Primary School Gold Cup Boys' and Girls' Football Tournament final at Ching Hla Mong Mari Stadium in Rangamati yesterday. The Minister also said, the CHT Ministry will work to develop new talented athletes in line with government directives as sports and cultural activities are essential for maintaining communal harmony in the hill region.

Education Minister Dr. ANM Ehsanul Hoque Milon said, the government has undertaken major initiatives to bring significant reforms to the country's education sector through a new curriculum and extensive improvements in teacher training. The Minister told the annual general meeting and reception programme of International Islamic University Malaysia Alumni Bangladesh Chapter at a hotel in the capital yesterday. The Minister also said, Bangladesh's education system must be brought to international standards to meet future challenges.

Disaster Management and Relief Minister Asadul Habib Dulu said, the canal excavation programme would bring a revolutionary change in the country's water management system. The Minister said this while speaking at the inauguration of re-excavation work of a canal from Dasherhat Chhara to AC Land office connection point at Arajai Palashbari mouza under Holokhana union in Kurigram yesterday.

Health and Family Welfare Minister Sardar Md. Sakhawat Hossain yesterday visited National Institute of Burn and Plastic Surgery the victims who sustained burn injuries in a gas explosion at a house in Fatullah of Narayanganj. Talking to reporters after the visit, the Minister said, the fire erupted when the house owner attempted to ignite a gas light, causing flames to spread throughout the house. The Minister also said, all-out efforts were made to ensure proper treatment of the victims and financial assistance would also be provided, if needed.

Shipping Minister Shaikh Rabiul Alam said, 16 government agencies under the Ministry are working to keep the waterways operational across the country. Bangladesh naturally has 16,000 kilometres of waterways, of which around 7,500 kilometres are currently operational the Minister added. The Minister said this while addressing the inaugural function of Maritime Safety Week-2026 at Ladies Club in the capital's Ramna area yesterday, organized by the Department of Shipping. State Minister for Shipping Md. Razib Ahsan also spoke at the function.

Chief Whip Md. Nurul Islam Moni said, the country must build a society free from drugs, evil forces and fascism where people can lead a peaceful and beautiful life. The Chief Whip said this while addressing a programme organized by Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy with the support of the Ministry of Cultural Affairs marking the 165th birth anniversary of Nobel laureate poet Rabindranath Tagore at the Jatiya Natyashala auditorium of the academy in the capital yesterday.

State Minister for Foreign Affairs Shama Obaed Islam appreciated the Baghdad for ensuring the welfare and safety of Bangladeshi nationals residing in Iraq amid the ongoing conflict in the Gulf region. The State Minister made the remarks when Charg, d'Affaires of the Embassy of Iraq in Dhaka Dr. Wisam Hussein Ali Al Ithawi paid a courtesy call on her at her Ministry in Dhaka yesterday. During the meeting, the State Minister expressed concern over the continuing conflict in the Middle East and hoped for an early restoration of peace, stability and normalcy in the region.

Bangladesh and Oman emphasized strengthening cooperation in labour migration, trade and investment, as Dhaka reaffirmed its zero-tolerance policy against illegal migration and stressed sending more skilled and semi-skilled workers abroad. The issues came up when Oman Ambassador to Bangladesh Jamil Haji Ismail Al Balushi paid a courtesy call on State Minister for Foreign Affairs Shama Obaed Islam at her office in Dhaka yesterday.

State Minister for Environment, Forest and Climate Change Shaikh Faridul Islam said, the government's main objective is to build a country free from drugs, terrorism, extortion and land grabbing, alongside prioritizing the complete elimination of banditry in the Sundarbans. The State Minister also said, law enforcement agencies must perform their duties without considering political identity or affiliation in order to establish a welfare-oriented state. The State Minister made the remarks while addressing the monthly meeting of the district law and order committee at the Collectorate Conference Room in Bagerhat town yesterday.

Bangladesh and Italy discussed expanding ongoing cooperation to ensure safer and regular migration management. The discussion took place when Prime Minister's Foreign Affairs Adviser Humaiun Kobir held a meeting with Italian Ambassador to Bangladesh Antonio Alessandro at the Prime Minister's Office in Tejgaon area yesterday. During the meeting, the two sides held fruitful discussions on further strengthening the longstanding friendly relations between Bangladesh and Italy and explored various issues of mutual interest. The Italian Ambassador expressed Italy's interest in importing quality products from Bangladesh, including ready-made garments, food products, leather and leather goods while both sides also discussed exploring new avenues for expanding bilateral trade.

Civil Aviation and Tourism Ministry issued an urgent warning against unregistered and expired travel agencies amid a human trafficking allegation, urging travelers to verify agency licenses before making financial transactions. The Ministry issued a press release in this regard yesterday.
