Newsbrief

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman has provided Eid bonuses to sanitation workers of city corporations across the country. The PM handed over Eid bonus cheques to the administrators and mayors of all city corporations across the country, said PM's Additional Press Secretary Atikur Rahman Ruman yesterday. The Prime Minister also instructed the administrators to keep their cities neat and clean and stressed the importance of building clean cities.

Women and Children Affairs Minister AZM Zahid Hossain said the government has adopted a zero-tolerance policy against any form of violence against women and children. The Minister made the remarks at a views-exchange meeting with locals at Hakimpur Hili Parishad hallroom in Dinajpur. Local political leaders, administrative officials, people from various professions, and party activists attended the event. The Minister discussed in detail the government's development activities, law and order situation, and social safety net programs.

Water Resources Minister Md. Shahiduddin Chowdhury Anne said a permanent embankment will be constructed on the Jamuna River in Tangail from the next fiscal year to curb river erosion and protect affected people in the area. The Minister made the announcement while addressing a views-exchange meeting with erosion-hit residents held on the ground of Mintu Memorial High School near the riverbank yesterday.

Disaster Management and Relief Minister Asadul Habib Dulu said the ongoing canal excavation programme would pave the way for a "green revolution" by restoring ecological balance, reviving water flow and strengthening agricultural production across the country. The Minister made the remarks while inspecting the re-excavation work of Dharar Khal in Trishal yesterday.

Road Transport and Bridges Minister Shaikh Rabiul Alam said the government is working in an integrated way to ensure safer roads across the country. Various initiatives are being implemented to reduce road accidents, including infrastructure development, training skilled drivers, controlling unfit vehicles, and increasing public awareness, the Minister told an event at District Shilpakala Academy yesterday. Cumilla District Administration and the BRTA Trustee Board organized the event of cheque distribution among road accident victims and family members.

Whip of the National Parliament Rakibul Islam Bakul underscored the importance of science education and research, saying there is no alternative to scientific learning to remain advanced in knowledge, intellect and innovation in the modern world. "Rapid advancements in science and technology are making lifestyles across the globe more modern and enriched. Science education and research are crucial for expanding knowledge, intelligence and innovative capabilities, the Whip said yesterday.

State Minister for Power, Energy and Mineral Resources Anindya Islam Amit announced plans to construct a new bridge in Jessore city to ease traffic congestion and reduce waterlogging. Alongside developing Jessore into a safe city free from drugs, terrorism and extortion, a new bridge would be constructed from Hazrat Garib Shah's Mazar to Ghop Nawapara Road, while the existing Katherpul Bridge would be widened to achieve the goal, the Minister said yesterday. The State Minister made the announcement while inaugurating road, drain and streetlight installation works worth around Tk 110 million in Wards No. 6 and 9 of Jessore Municipality yesterday.

Bangladesh has presented a special and groundbreaking healthcare model for persons with disabilities named 'Shishu Shorga' to the world. State Minister for Health and Family Welfare Dr. M A Muhit described this model at the World Health Assembly as the result of 20 years of research, saying that it has made it possible to reduce the average age of detecting disability in children from 5 years down to just 8 months. Consequently, necessary care for the child can be provided from a very early age, which is helping to rapidly improve their quality of life. The 'Shishu Shorga' model was presented at a high-level side event of the 79th World Health Assembly, held on Thursday at the Hotel Royale in Geneva of Switzerland.
