Newsbrief

President Mohammed Shahabuddin extended his warm greetings and felicitations to all members of Bangladesh Police on the occasion of Police Week 2026, calling for building the force as more humane, people-friendly and technology-driven. In a message yesterday marking the occasion, the President described Bangladesh Police as a traditional institution entrusted with maintaining the country's security and law and order. The Head of State paid profound respect to the brave police personnel who made supreme sacrifices while performing their duties at different times, including during the Great Liberation War and prayed for the eternal peace of the departed souls. The President also wished overall success of all programmers undertaken to mark 'Police Week 2026' and the continued success of the force.

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman said, restoring people's confidence in police and improving law and order is the priority of the government. The Prime Minister said, a professional and responsible police force is very important to safeguard country's stability and public confidence. The police week is a unique moment to fulfill the commitment of police to be a reliable force, the Prime Minister said. The Prime Minister said this in a message on the National Police Week-2026. A four-day programme marking the week begins today. The Prime Minister greeted all former and incumbent members of the police force. The Prime Minister also wished every success of the police week.

BNP Chairman and Prime Minister Tarique Rahman has joined a views-exchange meeting with district-level leaders of the ruling BNP and its three associate bodies. The day-long meeting held at the Krishibid Institution Bangladesh Auditorium in the capital's Farmgate area yesterday with BNP Senior Joint Secretary General Ruhul Kabir Rizvi in the chair. The Prime Minister said that before the election, his party promised to ensure good governance, create a country with a healthy educational environment for students and guarantee safety for women, men and children. The Prime Minister also urged the party leaders and activists to support the government to implement the manifesto.

BNP Secretary General and LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir said, rebuilding the country after pulling it out of destruction is now the new challenge for the government. The Minister made the remarks at an exchange-of-views meeting with district leaders of BNP, Jubo Dal, Swechchhasebak Dal and Chhatra Dal at Krishibid Institution Bangladesh in the capital yesterday.

Cultural Affairs Minister Nitai Roy Chowdhury said, the literature of world poet Rabindranath Tagore is one of the tools to remove darkness from society. The Minister also said, Rabindranath is the ray of sunshine of Bangla literature. Just as the sun removes darkness with its light, Rabindranath has also removed the darkness of consciousness through his timeless literature, the Minister added. The Minister made the remarks while addressing at the inaugural session of the three-day national programme organized on Friday on the occasion of the 165th birth anniversary of Rabindranath at Shilaidah Kuthibari in Kumarkhali Upazila of Kushtia, which is intertwined with the poet's memory.

Industries, Commerce, Textiles and Jute Minister Khandakar Abdul Muktedir said, the government is firmly committed to reopening the country's closed state-owned sugar mills, stressing that decisions would be taken prioritising the interests of sugarcane farmers, workers and the long-term commercial viability of the mills. The Minister made the remarks while addressing a view-exchange meeting with sugarcane farmers on the premises of Panchagarh Sugar Mills Limited in Panchagarh yesterday. The Minister also said, the sugar mills are assets of the people of Bangladesh and ensuring their honest and effective utilisation is the government's responsibility.

Land Minister Mizanur Rahman Minu said that sports and cultural activities play a vital role in developing talent, creativity and self-expression among students alongside academic education. The Minister made the remarks while addressing at the Annual Prize Giving Ceremony 2026 of Madinatul Ulum Kamil Madrasa in Rajshahi on Friday. The Minister also congratulated students who achieved success in sports and cultural competitions, saying such achievements reflect balanced development in education.

Water Resources Minister Md. Shahiduddin Chowdhury Anee said, the government has begun work to build a new Bangladesh by transforming the canal excavation programme initiated by Shaheed President Ziaur Rahman into a modern and scientific movement. The Minister made the remarks in an exclusive interview with the state-run Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha at his Secretariat office yesterday.

Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Minister Md. Asaduzzaman urged the judges to ensure justice by choosing the right path in delivering verdicts from a sense of responsibility. The Minister made the remarks while addressing the inaugural function of the 20th Orientation Course for Additional District and Sessions Judges at the Judicial Administration Training Institute complex in the capital yesterday. The Minister said, the government wants that the people's confidence on judges to grow stronger. The Minister also said, any form of corruption would not be tolerated and urged judges to remain vigilant in this regard.

Posts, Telecommunications and Information Technology Minister Faqir Mahub Anam said, the government will continue supporting cable operators in resolving their logical problems as the cable, ISP and broadcasting sectors are linked to the employment of millions of people across the country. The Minister made the remarks while speaking at the closing ceremony of the International Cable TV, Broadcasting and Communication Expo 2026 held at International Convention City Bashundhara in the capital yesterday.

Education Minister Dr. ANM Ehsanul Hoque Milon said, it is not enough to just study traditional education centered on GPA-5, but students should be developed as world-class citizens. The Minister made the remarks while speaking at the inaugural ceremony of the 'China-Bangladesh Education Cooperation Forum-2026' at the International Mother Language Institute in the capital yesterday. The event was organized by Chinese Embassy in Dhaka and managed by the China-Bangladesh Education and Cultural Exchange Association.

Bangladesh and Pakistan reaffirmed their commitment to deepening bilateral engagement and expanding cooperation across key sectors as senior Ministers of the two countries held talks in the capital, emphasizing regional connectivity and people-to-people contacts. The discussion took place when State Minister for Foreign Affairs Shama Obaed Islam met the visiting Pakistan's Home Minister Syed Mohsin Raza Naqvi at a hotel in Dhaka yesterday.

State Minister for Road Transport and Highways Division and Railways Ministry Habibur Rashid said, the government is giving special importance to improving rail connectivity in Sylhet. The State Minister made the remarks while talking to journalists after visiting Sylhet Railway Station yesterday.

Prime Minister's Foreign Affairs Adviser Humaiun Kobir said, Bangladesh is keen to maintain relations with the international community based on mutual respect, balance and national interests. The Adviser said this while speaking at an event at a hotel in Dhaka yesterday. Bangladesh Institute of Peace and Security Studies organized the event titled 'Bangladesh First: Vision of Foreign Policy for a New Bangladesh'.

Health Services Division Secretary Md. Kamruzzaman Chowdhury said, investigations are underway into the ongoing measles outbreak in the country, the reasons behind the vaccine shortage and the incidents of child deaths. The Health Secretary made the remarks while responding to questions from journalists at a roundtable discussion titled 'Measles Outbreak and the Way Forward' held at Bangladesh Medical University in the capital yesterday. The roundtable was organized by Bangladesh Health Reporters Forum.
