Newsbrief

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman thanked the law, justice and parliamentary affairs minister and the home minister for identifying and bringing the accused in the Ramisa murder case under the law, according to a press release of the Parliament Secretariat yesterday. The press release said the Prime Minister, at the Business Advisory Committee meeting held at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban, lauded the effective role played by the relevant ministries and law enforcement agencies in quickly identifying and bringing to justice those involved in the murder of Ramisa Akter (8), a second-grade student at Popular Model High School in the city's Pallabi area.

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman attended the third meeting of the Business Advisory Committee of the 13th Jatiya Sangsad (JS) with Speaker Hafiz Uddin Ahmad, Bir Bikram in the chair. The meeting was held at the cabinet room in the Sangsad Bhaban, said Prime Minister's Deputy Press Secretary Jahidul Islam Rony yesterday. Deputy Speaker Barrister Kayser Kamal, LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir, Finance Minister Amir Khosru Mahmud Chowdhury, Home Minister Salahuddin Ahmed and Jamaat-e-Islami Ameer Dr Md Shafiqur Rahman were present at the meeting, among others.

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman called for developing a skill and technology-based practical and job-oriented education system in the country instead of certificate-based education. The Prime Minister, also ruling BNP chairman, said this while addressing the inaugural session of a training programme on job-oriented and technical education for teachers at the Bangladesh-China Friendship Conference Center in the capital yesterday.

Foreign Minister Dr Khalilur Rahman left Dhaka on a three-day official visit to Russia, where the Minister is scheduled to hold talks with Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov on bilateral and international issues. Prime Minister's Foreign Affairs Adviser Humaiun Kobir is accompanying the Foreign Minister during the visit, said a foreign ministry press release yesterday.

Information and Broadcasting Minister Zahir Uddin Swapon said the media is an indispensable mirror of the state, society and modern civilisation, and its objectivity is vital to reflect reality accurately. The Minister made the remarks while speaking as the chief guest at a seminar titled "Good Governance in the Banking Sector and the Role of Media," organised by the Economic Reporters' Forum (ERF) in the capital's Paltan area yesterday.


Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Minister Md Asaduzzaman said the government is satisfied with the verdict in child Ramisa rape and murder case "for the time being" and hopes it will be upheld by the higher court. The Minister said the government was able to get the trial completed within six working days, adding that it was the first time in the country's judicial history that such a case was concluded within such a short period. The Minister said this at a press briefing at the ministry yesterday.

Health Minister Sardar Md Sakhawat Hossain said dengue is no longer an ordinary disease; it has become a major challenge for the entire nation, and every citizen must be involved in tackling the crisis. The Minister made the remarks while inaugurating the first batch of the National Training of Trainers Programme on Clinical Management of Dengue at Shaheed Dr Milon Hall of Bangladesh Medical University (BMU) in the capital yesterday.

Minister for Road Transport and Bridges, Railways and Shipping Sheikh Robiul Alam said that the government aims to establish an accountable governance system based on public participation in the service delivery system in the city corporations of the country. The Minister said this while addressing a public hearing hosted by the Dhaka South City Corporation (DSCC) for making its citizen services and development activities more dynamic, transparent, accountable

State Minister for Primary and Mass Education Bobby Hajjaj said Bangladesh aspires to reach the level of progress achieved by Turkey in science, technology and innovation in the future. To this end, the State Minister stressed the need to strengthen students' foundations in science, mathematics, technology and problem-solving skills from the primary level. The State Minister made the remarks when a delegation led by Vice President of Turkish Cooperation and Coordination Agency (TIKA) Dr. Ali Ercan met him at his office in the ministry, according to a PID release yesterday.

Prime Minister's Adviser on Education, Primary and Mass Education and spokesperson at the Prime Minister's Office Mahdi Amin said the National University (NU) would be transformed into one of the country's leading centres for producing skilled human resources, fostering innovation and developing responsible citizens. The Adviser said this while speaking as the special guest at the inauguration of a teacher training programme on "Skill-Based Education" in the National University curriculum at the Bangladesh-China Friendship Conference Center in the capital. Prime Minister Tarique Rahman formally inaugurated the programme yesterday.
