Newsbrief

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman has urged every citizen of the country to plant at least one tree sapling to build a clean and pollution-free environment for the next generation. The Premier made the call after formally inaugurating a nationwide programme to plant 25 crore trees by planting a garjan sapling at the Malumghat Reserved Forest in Dulahazara in Cox's Bazar yesterday. Earlier, the Prime Minister laid the foundation stone of the newly formed Pekua Municipality in the district. Besides, the Prime Minister offered ziarat at the grave of Mohammad Wasim Akram, who embraced martyrdom during the anti-discrimination student movement in July, 2024.

Reiterating that the country's people are the source of all power for BNP, Prime Minister and BNP Chairman Tarique Rahman said, BNP will continue working for the country and its people as long as its leaders remain alive. The Premier said this while addressing a brief rally after inaugurating the re-excavation work of the Patli canal in Pmkhali Union in Cox's Bazar yesterday.

Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperative Minister Mirza Fakhru Islam Alamgir said, BNP government wants to transform Bangladesh into a self-reliant, stable and industrially developed country where every citizen would enjoy the rightful benefits of prosperity and dignity. Fisheries, Livestock and Agriculture Minister Mohammed Amin Ur Rashid said, people who work for the welfare of society are often truly valued only after their death. The Minister was speaking at the 'Gunijan Sommanona-2026' ceremony held at the Kazi Nazrul Institute Centre in Cumilla yesterday. The event was organised by the Cumilla district unit of the Bangladesh Journalist Association.

Information and Broadcasting Minister Zahir Uddin Swapon said that Bangladeshi nationalism is the fundamental basis of the country's cultural and historical identity. The Minister made the remarks while addressing a discussion titled 'Implementation of the July Charter Signed for National Reconstruction' held at the Institution of Diploma Engineers in Kakrail in the capital yesterday.

Information and Broadcasting Minister Zahir Uddin Swapan said, July uprising in 2024 and the anti-autocracy movement of 1990 must be evaluated together to fully understand the history of Bangladesh's democratic movements. The Minister made the remarks at a discussion on 'Tarique Rahman's Vision for Future's Bangladesh' at National Press Club yesterday.

Education and Primary and Mass Education Minister Dr. A N M Ehsanul Hoque Milon said, a plan has been taken to distribute school dresses among nearly 4.5 lakh primary school students by July. Prime Minister's Foreign Affairs Adviser Humaiun Kobir said, Bangladesh wants cooperation and a constructive working relationship with India based on mutual respect despite the challenges currently affecting bilateral ties. The Adviser said this while speaking at a panel discussion during the 'Roadmap for Trade, Growth & Economic Diplomacy 2026' conference in Dhaka.
