BNP Secretary General and LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir said, the opposition parties are misleading the public over the July Charter. The Minister added that if people read the July Charter carefully, they would see that it clearly states the party elected to government will implement it in accordance with its election manifesto. The Minister told a memorial meeting marking the 6th death anniversary of Professor Emaz Uddin Ahmed at Jatiya Press Club in Dhaka yesterday. Professor Emaz Uddin Ahmed Research Center and Jatiya Sangbadik Samity jointly organized the event as a special prayer was also offered at the end of the programme seeking eternal peace of the departed soul of Prof. Emaz Uddin, ex-vice-chancellor of Dhaka University.

LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir expressed optimism that Bangladesh's economy will recover despite facing multiple challenges as garment industry would play a vital role as a key partner in the country's economic recovery. The Minister made the remarks while speaking at the "BAGMA Annual Program 2026", held at a capital's hotel yesterday. The Minister further said Bangladesh has the potential to move forward by building on the garment sector.

Finance and Planning Minister Amir Khasru Mahmud Chowdhury said, relief and rehabilitation efforts are already underway and the government's support will continue until full rehabilitation is completed. The Minister also said, around seven lakh people have been affected by the floods in Chattogram. More than one lakh people have already received relief assistance, while rehabilitation efforts for the flood victims are also underway. The Minister made the remarks while distributing relief among flood victims in the Patenga area in Chattogram yesterday.

Home Minister Salahuddin Ahmed said, the present BNP government is the true representative of the people and it will always stand by the people. The Minister also said that survey is being conducted by the government in the areas affected by floods. After the survey, necessary measures will be taken to rehabilitate damaged roads, educational institutions, embankments, and other infrastructures, as well as to assist affected farmers, so that they can return to normal life quickly. The Minister said this while distributing relief among flood victims in the Fashiakhali area of Chakaria Upazila in Cox's Bazar yesterday.

European Union and the Group of 77 and China have reaffirmed their support for Bangladesh's efforts to ensure a smooth, sustainable and irreversible graduation from the Least Developed Country (LDC) category. The assurances came during separate meetings held at the United Nations Headquarters in New York between Commerce Minister Khandakar Abdul Muktedir and Head of the European Union Delegation to the UN Ambassador Stavros Lambrinidis, and Chair of the Group of 77 and China and Permanent Representative of Uruguay to the UN Ambassador Laura Dupuy Lasserre, according to a press release yesterday. The Commerce Minister was accompanied by State Minister for Planning Zonayed Abdur Rahim Saki.

Information and Broadcasting Minister Zahir Uddin Swapon said, newly-elected British Prime Minister recently placed his ideas for his country echoing Premier Tarique Rahman's vision "I have a plan" that was uttered before the nation soon after returning home from London following Sheikh Hasina's downfall. The Minister made the remarks at a commemorative meeting organized by social organization 'Apon' at Bangladesh Supreme Court Bar Association, marking the birth and death anniversaries of Mahatma Bhagai Halder.

UNFPA Executive Director Diene Keita has pledged to champion Bangladesh's development initiatives globally, praising the country's political commitment to demographic resilience, women's empowerment, universal healthcare and inclusive social security system. The commitment came during a meeting with a Bangladesh delegation led by Adviser to the Prime Minister for Finance and Planning Dr. Rashed Al Mahmud Titumir at UNFPA Headquarters in New York yesterday. State Minister for Planning Zonayed Abdur Rahim Saki and Member of General Economics Division Dr. Monzur Hossain also attended the meeting.

Prime Minister's Finance and Planning Adviser Dr. Rashed Al Mahmud Titumir has called on the United Nations system to establish an international mechanism for debt restructuring, debt relief, debt suspension and sustainable debt solutions to help developing countries address mounting fiscal pressures arising from the Middle East crisis and other global shocks. The Adviser also said, such measures are essential to enable developing countries to sustain investment in children, women, education, health and social protection while keeping progress towards the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) on track, according to a release of permanent Mission of Bangladesh to the United Nations in New York yesterday.
