Newsbrief

A tree-planting initiative, under the 'One Child, One Tree' programme, will be rolled out at all government and MPO-affiliated secondary schools across the country. Prime Minister Tarique Rahman will inaugurate the programme at the national level at 10:00 am, said a press release from Learning Acceleration in Secondary Education (LAISE) project, under the Secondary and Higher Education Division of the Ministry of Education yesterday.

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman will attend a daylong national-level 'Startup, Science Project and Innovation Idea Showcasing' programme featuring the participation of secondary-level teachers and students at the Bangladesh-China Friendship Conference Center at 2pm. The Premier will also distribute awards to meritorious teachers for their contribution to quality education and the students with innovative quality on the occasion as the chief guest, said an official handout yesterday.

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman has asked the education ministry for nationalizing the Tindu Junior Secondary School, located in the remote Tindu area of Thanchi upazila in Bandarban district. Education Minister Dr. A.N.M. Ehsanul Hoque Milon said this in National Parliament during the general discussion on the proposed national budget for Fiscal Year 27, saying the ministry has made necessary action following the Prime Minister's instruction. Prime Minister's Additional Press Secretary Atikur Rahman Rumon said a report on social media came to the notice of the Prime Minister highlighting the extraordinary efforts of the school's head teacher, Bamong Khiang Minglen to help pay the salaries of the teachers by operating a motorised boat yesterday.

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman called upon the students to prepare themselves to help build a developed and prosperous Bangladesh describing the new generation as the country's future leaders. The Prime Minister made the call when hosting a luncheon for a group of students, teachers and visitors from various educational institutions, who enjoyed the parliamentary session, said PM's Deputy Press Secretary Jahidul Islam Rony yesterday.

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman directed the authorities concerned to develop the Bangladesh Space Research and Remote Sensing Organization (SPARRSO) as a modern, future-ready, self-reliant space research institution capable of making effective contributions to national security and development. The Premier arrived at the SPARRSO office in Sher-e-Bangla Nagar, Agargaon, at about 9:15 am on a surprise visit, Prime Minister's Deputy Press Secretary Jahidul Islam Rony said yesterday.

Social Welfare and Women and Children Affairs Minister Professor Dr A Z M Zahid Hossain said empowering women is indispensable to building a climate-resilient society, stressing that ensuring women's leadership is key to sustainable climate adaptation in Bangladesh. The Minister made the remarks as the chief guest at the National Lessons Learned and Scale-Up Workshop, organised under the "Empower Women for Climate-Resilient Societies (Phase II)" project at Aloki Convention Hall in the capital's Tejgaon yesterday.

Land Minister Md Mizanur Rahman Minu said the digitalization of services empowers people and increases transparency in public service delivery. The Minister said, Digitalization of services empowers people and enhances transparency in the government services. This also significantly reduces the dominance of middlemen. The Minister made the remark during a meeting with a delegation from Do Myoung Meta, a South Korean company. The delegation paid a courtesy call on the minister at his office in the National Parliament Building where the two sides discussed the use of advanced technologies in land management yesterday.

Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment minister Ariful Haque Chowdhury called on the Swiss ambassador to further intensify the cooperation and support between the two countries for developing more skilled manpower. The Minister made this call during a meeting with Swiss Ambassador to Bangladesh Reto Renggli at his office in the ministry yesterday.

Water Resources Minister Md. Shahiduddin Chowdhury Anee has said that the feasibility study for the Teesta mega project will be completed as quickly as possible so that work on the project can begin. The Minister made the remarks while speaking to the media before leaving for home after Prime Minister Tarique Rahman's official visit to China, where he accompanied the Premier yesterday.

Education Minister Dr A N M Ehsanul Hoque Milon announced that all examination centres for the upcoming Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) and equivalent examinations will be placed under continuous CCTV surveillance, while police personnel on duty will use body cameras to prevent the entry of unauthorized persons. The Minister made the remarks while addressing a meeting with the officers-in-charge of the HSC and equivalent examination centres under the Sylhet Education Board and the madrasa and technical education boards in the Sylhet region yesterday.

Health and Family Welfare Minister Sardar Md. Sakhawat Husain inaugurating Vitamin A capsule feeding campaign said the quality of this year's capsules is very good. The Minister made the remarks while addressing the inaugural function of the Vitamin A capsule feeding campaign for children as the chief guest at the Shaheed Abu Sayeed Convention Hall of Bangladesh Medical University yesterday.


