Newsbrief

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman has extended warmest felicitations to US President Donald Trump and the people of the United States of America on the momentous milestone of the country's 250th Independence Day. The Prime Minister wrote this in a letter to the US President yesterday. The Prime Minister said, Bangladesh is confident that with Trump's pragmatic leadership, the United States is on track for further greatness in the decades to come. The Prime Minister also wished good health, long life and continued success of Trump and the friendly people of the United States lasting peace, prosperity and happiness.

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman vowed to ensure proper recognition, rehabilitation and long-term support for the martyrs and those injured in the July Mass Uprising. The Prime Minister made the pledge while addressing the July National Conference at the Bangladesh-China Friendship Conference Center in Agargaon yesterday. The Prime Minister also said, the government remains committed to preserving the legacy of the July martyrs and honouring the sacrifices of those who were injured during the movement.

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman has asked the concerned officials to quickly complete the process of reopening loss-making and closed state-owned factories through domestic and foreign investment. The Prime Minister gave the directive in a meeting held to review the procedural progress for resume operation of the factories at his Tejgaon office yesterday. During the meeting, officials reported that many private companies have expressed interest in investing in those factories.

Speaker Hafiz Uddin Ahmad, Bir Bikram, has paid tribute on behalf of Bangladesh at the state funeral of Iran's late Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei in Tehran yesterday. During the programme, the Speaker met Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian and other senior leaders and signed the condolence book. Earlier, the Speaker held a bilateral meeting with Speaker of Iran's Islamic Consultative Assembly Mohammad Bagher Ghalibaf.

BNP Secretary General and LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Mirza Fakhru Islam Alamgir has stressed the importance of prioritizing merit in teacher recruitment at Thakurgaon University, saying the institution must achieve world standards instead of becoming a traditional university. The Minister made the remark while addressing the university's logo unveiling ceremony last night.

Finance Minister Amir Khosru Mahmud Chowdhury said, Bangladesh is moving towards becoming a trillion-dollar economy, driven by growing domestic and foreign investments and the government's long-term development strategy. Speaking to journalists at Shah Amanat International Airport during his visit to Chattogram yesterday, the Minister said that the national budget has been formulated with a focus on maximizing the country's regional economic potential and attracting investment. The Minister also said, Bangladesh is witnessing increasing inflows of investment, including foreign direct investment, capital market investment and contributions from international fund managers.

Home Minister Salahuddin Ahmed said, the banned Awami League will never be allowed to return to politics in Bangladesh and will soon face trial as a political party. Speaking at the July National Conference at the Bangladesh-China Friendship Conference Centre in Agargaon yesterday, the Minister said that legal provisions had already been amended to enable the prosecution of political parties.

Social Welfare Minister Dr. Abu Zafar Md. Zahid Hossain said that no one will be forgiven for dishonesty as the present government has adopted a zerotolerance policy against corruption. The Minister said this while talking to journalists after a meeting with officials of the Department of Social Services at the District Social Services Office auditorium in Rangpur yesterday.

States on the occasion of the country's 250th Independence Day, reaffirming Bangladesh's commitment to further strengthening bilateral relations. In a message posted on his official X account, the Minister said that Bangladeshis joined Americans in celebrating the historic occasion and reaffirmed their shared commitment to the common values of freedom, democracy and rights.

Cultural Affairs Minister Nitai Roy Chowdhury and State Minister for Cultural Affairs Ali Newaz Mahmud Khaiyam yesterday visited the Dhanmondi residence of ailing eminent Nazrul Sangeet artiste Shabnam Mushtari. During the visit, the Minister and the State Minister met the veteran singer's family members and inquired about her health condition and ongoing treatment, according to an official handout. Following reports of her illness, the Ministry of Cultural Affairs stepped up its support for the celebrated artiste.

Fisheries, Livestock and Agriculture Minister Mohammad Amin Ur Rashid stressed the need for active participation and awareness among local communities to protect the biodiversity and natural environment of the Halda River. The Minister also said, legal measures alone are not enough to conserve the Halda, stressing that meaningful river protection depends on the involvement of local residents alongside government initiatives. The Minister made the remarks while addressing a sewing machine distribution programme for fishermen under the Halda River Natural Fish Breeding Ground Development and Management Project (Phase II) in the Chattarghat area of Raojan upazila yesterday.

Information and Broadcasting Minister Zahir Uddin Swapon underscored the importance of free and responsible intellectual discourse, saying it is essential for ensuring peaceful coexistence in a world marked by diverse opinions, ideologies and cultures. The Minister made the remarks while inaugurating the international platform for global research, dialogue and knowledge-sharing, 'Al-Ummah Journal and Website', at a hotel in Tejgaon in the capital yesterday organized by Al-Ummah Foundation.

Posts, Telecommunications and Information Technology Minister Faqir Mahub Anam said, the present government is working tirelessly to improve the quality of education, develop modern educational infrastructure and ensure the delivery of important public services. The Minister said this while addressing a function marking the inauguration and foundation stone-laying of several development projects in the public health and education sectors in Madhupur, Tangail yesterday.


Health and Family Welfare Minister Sardar Md. Sakhawat Hossain said, government officials and employees found to be guilty of negligence and corruption would face dismissal instead of transfer. The Minister was addressing the 31st Annual General Meeting of the Narsingdi Diabetic Association at the Narsingdi Shishu Academy auditorium yesterday.

Deputy Speaker Barrister Kayser Kamal said, Bangladesh and the United States have made enduring contributions to each other's history and expressed optimism that the bilateral partnership would reach new heights through expanded cooperation in trade, technology, climate action and security. The Deputy Speaker said this while speaking at a musical performance marking the 250th anniversary of US independence at the South Plaza of Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban in Dhaka yesterday, organized by the US Embassy in Dhaka.

State Minister for Information and Broadcasting Yasser Khan Choudhury said, transparency and accountability must be ensured at every level of the administration to sustain the country's overall progress. The State Minister said this while addressing a views exchange meeting at Nandail Upazilla Auditorium in Mymensingh yesterday.

Prime Minister's Adviser and Spokesperson for the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) Mahdi Amin called on US investors to expand their investment in Bangladesh, saying the government is committed to ensuring a level playing field, policy stability and a business-friendly environment to attract more Foreign Direct Investment (FDI). The Adviser made the remarks while addressing an event at a hotel in the capital yesterday marking the 250 years of US independence organized by the American Chamber of Commerce in Bangladesh in association with the US Embassy in Dhaka.

US Ambassador to Bangladesh Brent T.
