Newsbrief

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman paid tributes at the Monument to the People's Heroes at the Tiananmen Square by placing a special red-green wreath. While placing the wreath, the national anthems of the two countries were played and the bugle sounded the last post. After laying the wreath at the Monument, the Prime Minister stood in solemn silence for some time as a mark of profound respect to the memory of the Chinese revolutionary heroes yesterday.

A total of 17 memoranda of understanding (MoUs) have been signed during Prime Minister Tarique Rahman's visit to China, according to Prime Minister's Office (PMO) spokesperson Mahdi Amin. Speaking at a press conference at the conference hall of the Diaoyutai Hotel, the Spokesperson said of these, 13 were signed between ministries of the two governments in the presence of the Prime Minister of Bangladesh and the Premier of China yesterday.

Prime Minister Tarique Rahman has expressed deep shock and sorrow at the loss of lives and extensive damage caused by terrible earthquake occurred in Venezuela. In a condolence message, the Premier expressed deep sympathy to the families of those who were killed in the earthquake yesterday.

Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives Minister Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir said the government will propose introducing a special allowance for families of victims of enforced disappearances and ensure justice by bringing those responsible to trial. The Minister made the remarks while addressing a national dialogue titled 'Right to Compensation and Rehabilitation', at the Krishibid Institution Bangladesh (KIB) auditorium in the capital yesterday.

Home Minister Salahuddin Ahmed said the government is hopeful of bringing back the accused in the Osman Hadi murder case from India. The Home Minister said the Indian government had arrested three suspected killers of Osman Hadi, and they were probably in Kolkata. The Minister made the comments while talking to reporters after attending a meeting at the Osmani Memorial Auditorium yesterday.

Home Minister Salahuddin Ahmed said the government is following a 'zero tolerance' policy against drugs and is working to implement the strategy strictly. The Minister made the remarks while addressing as the chief guest at a discussion and award-distribution ceremony yesterday.

Bangladesh and the Maldives have reaffirmed their resolve to further deepen their longstanding bilateral relations and expand cooperation at both bilateral and multilateral forums during a phone conversation between the two countries' foreign ministers. Maldives' Foreign Minister Iruthisham Adam recently held a telephone conversation with Bangladesh Foreign Minister Dr. Khalilur Rahman and discussed ways to deepen the friendly relations between the two countries according to a message received yesterday.

Cultural Affairs Minister Nitai Roy Chowdhury said the government is working tirelessly to preserve the grassroots-level culture and heritage of the country to ensure their balanced development. The Minister said this while speaking as the chief guest at an exchange of views organized on the initiative of the Deputy Commissioner at the Jhenaidah District Administration conference room, a press release said yesterday.

Land Minister Mizanur Rahman Minu, MP, said Rajshahi Collegiate School is a source of pride not just for Bangladesh, but for the entire subcontinent. Speaking on the school's upcoming bicentennial celebration in 2028, the Minister said the event would serve as a historic reunion. The Minister, who is himself an alumnus of the institution, made these remarks as the chief guest during a preparatory general meeting held on the school premises yesterday.

Land Minister Mizanur Rahman Minu, MP, said that those who are suddenly becoming owners of immense wealth and constructing large mansions through drug trafficking are, in fact, enemies of the nation. These anti-social elements must be identified, socially boycotted, and condemned. The Minister made these remarks while speaking as the chief guest at a discussion meeting and award distribution ceremony held at the Rajshahi Shilpakala Academy auditorium on the occasion of "International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking" yesterday.

Labour and Employment and Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment Minister Ariful Haque Chowdhury has directed that development planning in the agriculture sector should be based on practical data and that farmers must be involved in the process to ensure faster resolution of their problems. The Minister made the remarks while speaking as the chief guest at a distribution programme of agricultural inputs held at the Jaintapur Upazila Parishad auditorium yesterday.

Disaster Management and Relief Minister Asadul Habib Dulu has said that the government has taken initiative to simplify the licensing process for industrial and business sector to create new entrepreneurs and an investment-friendly environment. The Minister said this while speaking as the chief guest at the annual general meeting (AGM) of the Lalmonirhat Chamber of Commerce and Industry at the Chamber Building, a press note issued by the Rangpur Regional PID Office said yesterday.

Education Minister Dr A N M Ehsanul Hoque Milon said the government wants to impart quality education to student through establishing quality educational institutions. The Minister made the remark while addressing, as the chief guest an exchange of views meeting with centre secretaries under the Dinajpur Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education yesterday.

Deputy Speaker of the Jatiya Sangsad Barrister Kayser Kamal said the time has come to ensure justice for victims of enforced disappearance, killings and torture, calling on the state to accord them and their families due dignity through the formation of a parliamentary special taskforce. While presiding over the "National Dialogue on the Right to Compensation and Rehabilitation," organised by 'Mayer Dak' on the occasion of the International Day in Support of Victims of Torture 2026, the Deputy Speaker said ensuring justice, compensation, rehabilitation and psychological support for victims is an important responsibility of the state yesterday.

State Minister for Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives Mir Shahe Alam said the government's objective is not to punish people through fines or imprisonment, but to protect lives by building dengue-free cities through greater public awareness and participation. The State Minister made the remarks while inspecting an Aedes mosquito larva detection and elimination drive conducted on Road No. 18, 21 and 24 in the capital's Banani area under the initiative of the nationwide mosquito-borne disease prevention task force yesterday.

State Minister for Information and Broadcasting Yasser Khan Choudhury called for giving the highest priority to cybersecurity and digital trust to sustain the country's rapid digital transformation. The State Minister made the remark while inaugurating Phoenix Summit 2026 at the China Friendship Conference Center in the city yesterday.
