

- A **preposition** is a word or group of words used to show the relationship between a noun or pronoun and other parts of a sentence.
- Prepositions often indicate direction, location, time, or introduce an object.

- For example, in the sentence “The book is on the table,” the word “on” is a preposition that shows the relationship between “book” and “table”

- **Direction**
- **To:** She walked to the store.
- **From:** He came from the office.
- **Towards:** They moved towards the exit.



- **Location**

- **In:** The cat is in the box.
- **On:** The book is on the table.
- **Under:** The dog is under the bed.
- **Above:** The picture hangs above the sofa.



- **Time**
- **At:** The meeting starts at 9 AM.
- **During:** We stayed indoors during the storm.
- **Before:** Finish your homework before dinner.
- **After:** Let's go for a walk after lunch.




- **Spatial Relationship**

- **Between:** The ball is between the shoes.
- **Among:** She found her keys among the papers.
- **Behind:** The car is parked behind the building.
- **In front of:** The statue is in front of the museum.




- **Introducing an Object**
- **Of:** The cover of the book is blue.
- **With:** He came with his friend.
- **For:** This gift is for you.



Common Mistakes with Prepositions

- **Incorrect Preposition Choice**
 - **Incorrect:** She is waiting the bus.
 - **Correct:** She is waiting for the bus.
- **Omitting Necessary Prepositions**
 - **Incorrect:** He is good math.
 - **Correct:** He is good at math.
- **Using the Wrong Preposition for Time**
 - **Incorrect:** I will meet you in Monday.
 - **Correct:** I will meet you on Monday

Using the Wrong Preposition for Place

- Incorrect:** The cat is in the table.
- Correct:** The cat is on the table.

Confusing Prepositions of Direction

- Incorrect:** She walked in the room.
- Correct:** She walked into the room.

Incorrect Preposition with Verbs

- Incorrect:** He depends of his parents.
- Correct:** He depends on his parents.

Incorrect Preposition with Adjectives


- Incorrect:** She is interested for the job.
- Correct:** She is interested in the job.

Incorrect Preposition with Nouns

- Incorrect:** The impact in the environment was significant.
- Correct:** The impact on the environment was significant.
