

School Led Community Resilience to Disaster and Climate Risks (SLCRDCR)

Phase I & II Completion Summary

Project Goal

To strengthen school and community resilience to disasters and climate change through safer infrastructure, inclusive DRR systems, and School-led preparedness.

Phase I (2023–2024)

- Beneficiaries: **1,592 students, 52 teachers, and 100 DRR Champions.**
- **5 schools** renovated and refurbished to ensure continued education during disasters and used as school-cum-shelters.
- Ensured inclusiveness for **girls and persons with disabilities (PWDs).**
- Provided classroom renovation/repair, shelter renovation/repair, flood-resistant deep tube wells, water reservoirs, solar power supply, lightning protection systems, and segregated WASH facilities for boys, girls, and PWDs.
- Implemented school safety plans, gender action plans, mock drills, awareness campaigns, and tree plantation initiatives.

Phase II (2024–2025)

- Beneficiaries: **1,847 students, 63 teachers, and 100 DRR Champions.**
- **5 additional schools** renovated and refurbished for continued education in disaster periods and use as school-cum-shelters.
- Ensured inclusiveness for **girls and persons with disabilities (PWDs).**
- Upgraded facilities including classroom and shelter repair, flood-resistant deep tube wells, water reservoirs, solar power systems, lightning protection systems, and segregated WASH facilities.
- Expanded DRR training, distributed disaster kits, conducted fire and flood drills, and strengthened coordination with UDMC, UzDMC, and DDMC.

Looking Ahead: Phase III (2025–2026)

Phase III will scale up to **11 new schools** and provide follow-up in 10 existing schools. The project will benefit **7,718 students, 299 teachers, 94 staff, and 63 youth volunteers** across five unions of Sundarganj, ensuring resilient schools and safer communities.
