**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) ON MUTUAL
COOPERATION**

TRADING CORPORATION OF BANGLADESH (TCB), A STATUTORY
ORGANIZATION OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE PEOPLE'S
REPUBLIC OF BANGLADESH

AND

SASKATCHEWAN TRADE AND EXPORT PARTNERSHIP (STEP), A
GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN AND SASKATCHEWAN
INDUSTRY PARTNERSHIP, CANADA

Considering

That for TCB and STEP primary objectives guiding their respective activities are:

- The commercial promotion, on an international level, of products and services of Bangladesh and Saskatchewan;
- The development and delivery of international projects and initiatives for exporters and companies ready to export,

conclude the following MOU

Saskatchewan Trade and Export Partnership (STEP) and the Trading Corporation of Bangladesh (TCB) agree to promote expansion of trade and business relations between the Province of Saskatchewan and Bangladesh. The mode of this co-operation is set out in the following articles.

ARTICLE I

The parties will use their best endeavours to promote trade and business relations between the Province of Saskatchewan and Bangladesh and share information as is publicly available on important economic and trade issues, including developments in their respective economic and trade policies which might affect trade and business relations between the Province of Saskatchewan and Bangladesh.

ARTICLE II

The parties will exchange trade enquiries from their respective home markets.

ARTICLE III

The parties agree to provide such current market information and business contacts to each other upon request.

ARTICLE IV

Each party will actively promote exchange visits of businessmen in pursuit of industrial and commercial joint-ventures. This assistance and support however can only be supplementary to the efforts of STEP's and TCB's own representatives respectively in Saskatchewan and Bangladesh.

ARTICLE V

The parties will offer all reasonable assistance in respect of visiting trade missions, including but not limited to, supplying relevant market information and facilitating the introduction of visiting trade missions to representatives of relevant industries.

ARTICLE VI

This MOU shall enter into force on the date of its signature by the representatives of both parties concerned and will remain valid for two years.

It will be extended automatically, by one year at a time, unless written notice is given by one party to the other for termination of the MOU not less than six months before the next date of expiration. The MOU will be executed on a best effort basis and is not intended to create any legal obligation for either institution.


This MOU is signed in Bangladesh on March 14, in the year 2011.


