There is no denying that education is the backbone of a nation. For giving learners access to quality education, institutions should update or reform their curricula after a certain period or when it seems necessary. The update or reform should be done in the light of the cultural needs, technological advancement and global competition, after reviewing the existing curricula critically.

Development and innovations are taking place in every branch of knowledge and new challenges are emerging with the passage of time. How will an institution keep its students abreast of the development and equip them with the knowledge and skills to face the challenges if it does not update its curricula?

In Bangladesh, curriculum reform is an ignored area in higher studies. Most of the higher educational institutions are offering courses based on curricula developed decades ago, resulting in the country failing to maintain the quality of education and falling behind in the global competition.

Let alone the global competition, many graduates in Bangladesh are devoid of the knowledge and skills required in the local job market. The struggle of employers to find suitable candidates despite the existence of numerous job-seeking educated people in the market, and hiring of many foreigners in industries in Bangladesh manifest the real state of higher education.

Had our higher educational institutions updated curricula when it was needed and offered time-befitting education, they themselves as well as the country would have been benefited greatly. As education providers, their image would have been brighter locally as well as globally while the country could have retained many students, who went abroad for better higher studies, and thus saved huge foreign exchange spent for them.

The educational institutions which are following the same curricula for decades should waste no more time to update and reform them. We need to keep in mind that quality is never an accident; it is always the result of efforts. Our institutions should make those efforts.

Annual Report-2018 of UGC submitted to President



A delegation from University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh led by its Chairman Professor Dr. Kazi Shahidullah submitted the Annual Report-2018 to Hon'ble President Md. Abdul Hamid at Bangabhaban on 29 December 2019.

The President, who is the chancellor of the universities, asked the University Grants Commission to play its due role to ensure proper academic environment and quality education in the universities of the country.

"Take necessary steps to make education more time-befitting at all public and private universities," the President told the delegation.

He laid stress on the need for introducing time-befitting and world-standard academic curriculum to acquaint the graduates with the global competition.

The head of the state urged the UGC authorities to consider adoption of an identical teacher appointment policy as over 150 public and private universities are now functioning in the country.

He was apprised by the UGC chairman of different activities of the commission, including infrastructural development and curriculums.

The UGC chairman informed the President about holding admission tests at seven agricultural universities under the cluster system, which reduced the sufferings of admission seekers and their guardians.

He told the president that they had taken a strategic plan to introduce a uniform appointment policy for pro-vice chancellors and treasurers of the universities.

The UGC would set up a quality and time-befitting research centre, Shahidullah added, seeking the president's all-out cooperation in this connection.

President Abdul Hamid gave a patient hearing to the delegation and assured them of his all-out cooperation.

UGC delegation meets Prime Minister



A delegation from University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh led by its Chairman Professor Dr. Kazi Shahidullah met Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina on 17 October 2019 at her office.

The Prime Minister directed the University Grants Commission not to go beyond the rules in overseeing public and private universities. "Don't go beyond the rules. Follow them properly," she said.

Sheikh Hasina said that the UGC would be empowered by enacting new law. She directed the UGC to strengthen its capacity and monitor the colleges affiliated with public universities.

The UGC delegation informed the Prime Minister about the activities and development of the apex

body entrusted with the responsibility of overseeing the higher education in the country.

Professor Shahidullah said that there were currently 155 public and private universities in the country, but the manpower of UGC remain unchanged for long. So, the manpower of the UGC needs to be increased to deal with the large number of the institutes.

He also informed the Prime Minister that the UGC has prepared the research policy and said that the commission needs a training academy for the teachers like Public Administration Training Academy.

Deputy Minister for Education Mohibul Hassan Chowdhury, Prime Minister's Principal Secretary Md. Nojibur Rahman and PMO Secretary Sajjadul Hassan were present at the time. UGC Members Professor Dr. M. Shah Nowaz Ali, Professor Dr. Dil Afroza Begum, Professor Dr. Md. Sazzad Hossain and Professor Dr. Muhammed Alamgir were in the delegation.

In his speech, the chief guest said that the best practices in manners have to be cultivated from the grass-root level. He urged all concerned to do something good for the development of the country by discharging their duties with sincerity, honesty and integrity.

In his speech, the UGC chairman said that corruption is number one problem of the country. The development of the country is possible if the menace could be curbed, he added.

Annual Performance Agreement, Sustainable Development Goal-4, the 7th and 8th Five-Year Plans, National Education Policy-2010, relevant higher education policies and their implementation at the university level, election manifesto and review of annual performance agreements signed between UGC and 46 public universities came up for the discussion in the two-day event.

Annual Performance Agreement is signed between UGC and public universities of the country with a view to making the activities of universities transparent, accountable, dynamic and vibrant.

The government has declared National Integrity Strategy Implementation for ensuring the best practices in manners at workplaces of the employees of the state.

Develop curriculum based on technology: Palak

State Minister for Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Division Zunaid Ahmed Palak urged the academicians to prepare curriculum to keep pace with rapid technological advancement.



He made the call while speaking at a workshop on 'Skills Development of ICT Engineers on IT Engineers Examination (ITEE) Targeting Japanese Market' held at UGC on 13 November 2019.

The state minister said that significant number of jobs would be created in the IT sector through the workshop organised jointly by University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh and Bangladesh Computer Council (BCC).

Talking on updating curriculum, he said, "It's a difficult task to update curriculum every year. In this case, universities can initiate top-up training programmes to address the global needs."

The workshop was organised to raise awareness and facilitate the IT Engineers Examination so that the Bangladeshi IT graduates can enhance their knowledge and skills.

Mr. Palak laid emphasis on adopting 4IR (4th Industrial Revolution) programmes replacing labour-oriented jobs to get developed nation status by 2041. "We are working to create a pool of quality manpower, enhance graduates' employability and meet objectives of Digital Bangladesh. Academicians need to carry out research on 4IR. The ICT ministry in association with UGC will set up research and incubation centres, specialised labs in every university," he added.

In his presidential speech, UGC Chairman Professor Dr. Kazi Shahidullah said that skill requirements of jobs have changed enormously in the last decades with the advancement of technology.

"We need to take steps to prepare our youth force for the global markets. Our graduates need to be trained well with the updated knowledge and

skills... Japan has opened up market for our IT graduates. We have to take its full advantage," he said.

UGC Member and convener of the workshop committee Professor Dr. Md. Sazzad Hossain, in his address of welcome, said, "Knowledge and technology will be exchanged through ITEE and it will also help transform our graduates into human recourses."

ICT Division Senior Secretary NM Ziaul Alam, Minister at the Embassy of Japan Hiroyuki Yamaya, BCC Executive Director Parthapratim Deb and Japan External Trade Organisation Country Representative Yuji Ando also spoke at the workshop.

UGC members, vice chancellors from different public and private universities, faculty members of engineering departments and IT entrepreneurs were present.

Abdul Mannan Akanda, former Vice Chancellor and retired professor of Plant Pathology at Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Agricultural University.

Besides, the commission nominated Professor Dr. Amatul Laila Zaman of Bangla Department at the University of Chittagong as Rokeya Chair to commemorate the contribution of Begum Rokeya to education, empowerment and development of women in the country.

UGC arranged a get-together in honour of the new UGC Professors and Rokeya Chair at its auditorium on 26 October 2019. National professors, the UGC chairman and members, former UGC chairmen and members, former UGC professors, former Rokeya chairs, full commission members, vice chancellors from Dhaka-based public universities and divisional heads of UGC were present on the occasion. They exchanged views on various aspects of higher education at the event.

At the outset of the programme, UGC Chairman Professor Dr. Kazi Shahidullah welcomed all participants. He expressed his optimism that the

newly appointed UGC Professors and Rokeya Chair will contribute more to nation-building activities from their respective positions. He said the commission feels proud to have nominated them for the dignified posts.

Meeting to evaluate activities of public universities under APA at UGC



University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh organised a meeting to evaluate the activities of the public universities in 2018-2019 financial year done under Annual Performance Agreement (APA) at its auditorium on 01 October 2019. UGC Chairman Professor Dr. Kazi Shahidullah graced the event as the chief guest.

Earlier, UGC signed the APA with the public universities under Performance Management Framework Policy of the government to establish good governance and excellence in the higher educational institutions.

The chief guest called upon the vice chancellors of the country's public universities to ensure transparency and accountability in their activities. "It's now a major issue to ensure transparency and accountability at public universities. We have to remain alert for overcoming the current situation," he said.

He said that the registrar is the key person of a university on whom the performance of the institution depends a lot. "In the past, vice chancellors largely depended on the registrars to perform the administrative jobs efficiently. But at present, a number of universities are being run by acting registrars as the nation faces skilled and talented registrars," he added.

In his presidential speech, UGC Member Professor Dr. M. Shah Nowaz Ali said that a volatile situation is prevailing in public universities. He urged the vice chancellors to discharge their duties properly to overcome the situation.

Registrars of 46 public universities, high officials from the Ministry of Education, UGC and focal points of APA were present on the occasion.

52nd Convocation of Dhaka University



The 52nd Convocation of Dhaka University was held on the campus on 09 December 2019 with the participation of 20,796 graduates. President Md. Abdul Hamid, who is the chancellor of the universities, presided over the convocation ceremony and conferred degrees on the graduating students.

Nobel laureate Dr. Takaaki Kajita, Special University Professor and also the Director of the Institute for Cosmic Ray Research at Tokyo University, addressed the programme as the convocation speaker.

The President said that commercial courses are turning public universities into business organisations and disrupting the atmosphere on the campus. "Thousands of graduates are being produced every year with these commercial courses. A section of teachers is making a mint [from these courses]... and turning the universities into business institutions," he said.

Abdul Hamid said that there is a question about how many students are benefiting from these degrees. "Many public universities assume the character of private universities at night... This is unacceptable."

The President said that some teachers are reluctant to take classes of regular courses, but are very serious about evening and diploma courses, and classes at private universities.

“It is because they get cash benefits from the private universities. But remember, the [public] universities are run with taxpayers’ money. So, you have to be accountable to the people.”

The chancellor said that it is the responsibility of the vice chancellors and other teachers to ensure proper use of university funds.

“But the activities of some vice chancellors and teachers make it seem like they have forgotten what the main work of the university is. The work is not just to impart knowledge, but to apply the acquired knowledge,” the President added.

Terming research a very important and fundamental task of higher educational institutions, the President said that there is a lot of criticism about the quality of research. It has to be taken into consideration whether a research has been conducted for promotion or as a basic research work, he said.

Abdul Hamid said that many departments have more professors than teachers in other posts. “After having administrative posts, many teachers forget their identity as teachers.”

He also criticised the authorities of some universities for a number of recent incidents. He said that the image of the universities and the reputation of students were tarnished by some inhuman and undesirable incidents. “These unexpected incidents could have been prevented in many cases had the authorities taken the right steps in time. The university authorities concerned cannot avoid the responsibilities.” He expressed the hope that the authorities would take proper steps in this regard.

Thanking Nobel laureate Dr. Takaaki Kajita for his gracious presence at the convocation, the President said that his presence provided an impetus for talent of the graduates.

Ninety-eight students received gold medals from the President while PhD and MPhil degrees were conferred on 57 and 14 students respectively. Seven DU-affiliated colleges also joined the convocation ceremony from two venues -- Dhaka College and Eden Mohila College -- through videoconferencing.

11th Convocation of Rajshahi University



The 11th Convocation of Rajshahi University was held on 30 November 2019 at Sheikh Kamal Stadium.

President Md. Abdul Hamid, who is the chancellor of the universities, presided over the event. In his speech, the President urged university teachers not to compromise with principles and ideals to serve any narrow personal interest.

“It is seen that a section of teachers remains busy with lobbying to get better administrative positions ignoring their duties. Sometimes they use students or involve in illegal dealings to serve their narrow interests... But It is really disgraceful as well as undignified,” he said.

The President said that the negative news items that different media outlets run involving teachers and students seriously hurt him.

He urged the teachers to uphold their dignity in their profession through their works as the teachers are the symbols of ideals and principles.

“You are politically conscious. There may be some differences in opinions and thoughts with each other. But you must ensure that this dissimilarity doesn’t affect the institution and learners in any way,” the President said.

Abdul Hamid advised those who speak against corrupt practices should stay away from all sorts of corruption and misdeeds.

Congratulating the new graduates, he urged them to remember the contributions of their parents, teachers, society, country and people to making them successful graduates.

“Don’t forget your country and general people. Try to repay your debt through utilising your talent, works and honesty as you owe a lot to them for

their bearing your educational expenses in many ways,” he said.

The President also called upon the graduates and family members to contribute to the celebration of the birth centenary of Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman in 2020 and Golden Jubilee of country's War of Independence in 2021.

Referring to the contributions of RU teachers and students to the struggle for independence and the liberation war, the President asked the authorities concerned to engage all in building a developed Bangladesh in line with that spirit.

At the convocation, degrees were conferred on 3,432 students.

Education Minister Dr. Dipu Moni, Rajshahi City Corporation Mayor AHM Khairuzzaman Liton, lawmakers, convocation speaker Vice Chancellor of Vidyasagar University of India Professor Ranjan Chakrabarti, RU Vice Chancellor Professor M Abdus Sobhan, Pro-Vice Chancellor Chowdhury Professor M Zakaria and treasurer Professor AKM Mostafizur Rahman Al-Arif, among others, were present on the occasion.

6th Convocation of Khulna University



The 6th Convocation of Khulna University was held on its campus on 22 December 2019. President Md. Abdul Hamid, who is the chancellor of the universities, presided over the convocation. He urged the teachers not to compromise with ideals and to devote themselves to acquiring knowledge and disseminating it among students.

“When teachers move away from their ideals, it creates a negative impact on students,” he said.

President Hamid said that teachers and researchers are valuable resources of the nation.

Terming universities a centre of hope and aspiration, he stressed the need for conducting international standard research.

He urged researchers of Khulna University to conduct more studies on biodiversity and coastal resources as the region's coastline is rich with marine resources.

Before attending the convocation, the President inaugurated a mural of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman titled ‘Kaljoyee Mujib’ near the university's main gate, marking the birth centenary of the Bangabandhu.

The campus wore a festive look on the occasion of the convocation. Academic and administrative buildings, residential halls and the vice chancellor's residence were illuminated.

This year, a total of 4,478 students received their graduation certificates, 2,530 postgraduate certificates while MPhil degree was conferred on five researchers and doctorate degree on eight researchers.

Seventeen students received their postgraduate diplomas in education and 23 students were awarded gold medals.

Education Minister Dr. Dipu Moni, Khulna City Corporation (KCC) Mayor Talukder Abdul Khaleque and University Grants Commission (UGC) Chairman Professor Dr. Kazi Shahidullah were present, among others.

Degrees were conferred on 2,231 graduates at the convocation. Three of them received gold medals for their outstanding academic results. Two achieved Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) degree.

According to the UGC chief, there is mismatch between the actual knowledge acquired and the grade received by the students in their exam results.

“Earlier, we used to select students based on their merit position. Today, we’re not happy with their knowledge level against their acquired grade points. Even, GPA 5 holders fail to get admitted to universities. It’s creating problems in society,” he noted.

“We have many students but they don’t have the required knowledge and skills to get proper jobs due to lack of qualified teachers. It is a teachers’ problem as they are not properly trained. The situation will not improve until teachers’ quality improves,” he added.
