From the Desk of the Editor

The journey of higher education began in present-day Bangladesh through the establishment of the University of Dhaka in 1921. Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman established the University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh in 1973, when the number of public universities in the country was only six. With the expansion of educational institutions at the secondary and higher secondary levels, the demand for higher education increased phenomenally. To accommodate the majority of the students wishing to pursue higher education, the government opened up tertiary education to the private sector through the enactment of the Private University Act 1992. A massive expansion of higher education has taken place in both the public and private sectors in the country since the nineties. The number of universities has now stood at 152 – 47 public and 105 private – raising the enrollment at the tertiary level to 40 lakhs. With the surge in the number of universities and students, a question has arisen regarding the quality of education imparted by these universities. The objectives of setting up higher educational institutions will not be fulfilled until and unless the quality and standard of higher education is ensured.

There is no alternative to quality higher education for a rapidly growing country like Bangladesh for building the nation. Entrusted with the responsibilities of overseeing activities of the universities, the UGC, under the dynamic and visionary leadership of its new Chairman Professor Dr. Kazi Shahidullah, is attaching topmost priority to the quality of education and research. Keeping this in view, the Commission has started working to promote quality academic culture through the establishment of Institutional Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in universities and materialize the Strategic Plan for Higher Education in Bangladesh: 2018-2030 approved by the government. The Commission is also planning to take other necessary steps to facilitate Bangladeshi universities securing prestigious places in the global rankings of higher educational institutions.

The April-June 2019 issue of the UGC Bulletin contains information about events pertaining to higher education of Bangladesh and activities of the UGC. It is hoped that the present issue will be useful to those who are interested to learn about the activities of the UGC and status of higher education in Bangladesh.

SAARC University to celebrate Bangabandhu's 100th birth anniversary

South Asian University (SAU), popularly known as SAARC University, will celebrate the 100th birth anniversary of Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman in 2020 with due respect and festivity. The decision was taken at SAU's Financial Experts Committee meeting held in New Delhi, India on 14 June, 2019. Dr. Kavita A Sharma, President of SAU, presided over the meeting where representatives from seven member states of South Asian Association for Regional Co-operation (SAARC) were present. Professor Dr. M. Shah Nowaz Ali, Member of University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh, took part in the meeting and placed the proposal to celebrate the birth anniversary of Bangabandhu on 17 March, 2020. Members participating in the meeting welcomed the proposal and unanimously approved it.

In the meeting, Professor Shah Nowaz Ali said a seminar, workshop or cultural programme may be organized to celebrate the birth anniversary of



Bangabandhu. The government of Bangladesh will bear the expenditure of the celebration.

Later Professor Shah Nowaz Ali said Pakistan initially opposed his proposal, but later accepted it. He said the celebration of Bangabandhu's 100th birth anniversary in SAARC University will be a great achievement for Bangladesh. "From this, youngsters of SAARC countries can enrich their knowledge about Bangabandhu and know his contributions to the Liberation War of Bangladesh. The celebration programme will play an important role in promotion of peace and prosperity in the SAARC region and develop relationship among its member countries."

South Asian University is an international university established by the eight member states of SAARC. SAU started its operations from the academic year 2010.

Int'l Convention of Vice-Chancellors held at SUST



An International Convention of Vice-Chancellors was held at Shahjalal University of Science and Technology (SUST) on 05 April, 2019. Vice-Chancellors of 23 universities from Bangladesh and India took part in the convention. Dr. Dipu Moni, Minister for Education, attended the inaugural ceremony of the convention as the Chief Guest.

Professor Abdul Mannan, Chairman of University Grants Commission of Bangladesh, Professor Dr. Md. Farid Uddin Ahmad, Vice-Chancellor of SUST, Dr. Mridul Hazarika, Vice-Chancellor of Gauhati University, and Mr. Mahbubul Haque, Chancellor of Meghalaya Science and Technology University, India, among others, addressed the event. Professor Dr. Abul Mukid Mohammad

Mukaddes, Dean of the School of Applied Science and Technology at SUST, chaired the programme.

Speaking at the programme, the Education Minister said Bangladesh and India should work together to enhance research work to improve the quality of education in both the countries. “Both Bangladesh and India will be able to advance the education sector, if the two countries strengthen their bonding on different disciplines of education, particularly science and technology,” she said.

The Hon’ble Minister also said, “Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman established a historical relationship between Bangladesh and India. Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina is following his footsteps to further strengthen the bilateral relations of the two countries.”

Welcoming the knowledge-sharing gathering among Vice-Chancellors of Bangladesh and India, the UGC Chairman said the convention will produce outcomes for improving quality of education at the higher level.

There is no alternative to sharing and exchanging knowledge, particularly on science and technology, he said. “A joint collaboration between Bangladesh and India should be developed in education sector to keep pace with the technologically advanced world.”

46 public universities sign APA with UGC



Forty-six public universities of the country signed an Annual Performance Agreement (APA) with University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh for 2019-2020 fiscal year under the Performance Management Framework Policy of the government. The goals of the agreement are to establish good governance and attain excellence in higher educational institutions.

Professor Dr. Kazi Shahidullah, Chairman of UGC, attended the signing ceremony as the Chief Guest. With Professor Dr. M. Shah Nowaz Ali, Member of UGC, in the chair, the event was attended also by UGC Members Professor Dr. Md. Akhtar Hossain, Professor Dr. Dil Afroza Begum, Professor Dr. Md. Sazzad Hossain and Professor Dr. Muhammed Alamgir.

Dr. Md. Khaled, Secretary of UGC, and registrars of the universities concerned signed the agreement on behalf of their respective organisations at UGC on 20 June, 2019.

Speaking at the programme, Professor Kazi Shahidullah said the main responsibility of UGC is to ensure quality higher education and research in the country to keep pace with today’s world. “Quality of education is slipping. Everyone questions about the quality of education. We need to seriously look into it,” he said. Professor Shahidullah sought cooperation and assistance from the teachers’ community and other stakeholders to ensure quality of tertiary education.

Speaking on the performance of Bangladeshi universities in international rankings of higher educational institutions, he said UGC will pay special attention to the matter.

Calling teachers the backbone of a nation, he said the teachers’ community should be more committed and dedicated to the wellbeing of the country. “Nation expects more from the teachers’ community. We need to be focused and result-oriented,” he noted.

Professor Kazi Shahidullah laid emphasis on ensuring good governance, transparency and accountability at universities to curb corruption and other malpractices. He suggested producing skilled and accomplished workforce to meet the future challenges.

Professor Dr. Md. Akhtaruzzaman, Vice-Chancellor of Dhaka University, Professor Dr. Farzana Islam, Vice-Chancellor of Jahangirnagar University, and Professor Dr. Kanak Kanti Barua, Vice-Chancellor of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University, also spoke on the occasion. Vice-Chancellors, Registrars, focal points of APA, high officials from the Ministry of Education and UGC were present.

NU, 74 colleges sign agreement to enhance quality of college education



National University (NU), Bangladesh and 74 colleges affiliated to the university on 25 June, 2019 signed an agreement at UGC to enhance the quality of college-level education. NU and the selected public and private colleges signed the agreement under College Education Development Project (CEDP). Professor Dr. Kazi Shahidullah, Chairman of UGC, was present at the agreement signing ceremony as the Chief Guest while Professor Dr. Harun-or-Rashid, Vice-Chancellor of National University, Bangladesh, presided over the ceremony. The Vice-Chancellor of National University and Principals and representatives of the colleges concerned signed the agreement on behalf of their respective organisations.

The five-year long CEDP was designed in 2016 to strengthen the strategic planning and management capacity of the college education subsector, and to improve the teaching and learning environment of the selected colleges. CEDP is jointly being implemented by the UGC and National University, Bangladesh, which has taken the initiatives to provide development grants to the selected colleges, numbering 122, which are offering Honours and Master's programmes.

Speaking at the programme, the UGC Chairman said the agreement will certainly improve the environment of higher education scenario at the college level. He expressed the hope that the project will play a crucial role in reducing unemployment problem in the country.

Professor Kazi Shahidullah joins UGC as 13th Chairman



Dr. Kazi Shahidullah, Supernumerary Professor of the History Department, University of Dhaka, joined the University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh as its 13th Chairman on 26 May, 2019. He took over the charge from Professor Dr.

Mohammad Yousuf Ali Mollah, the Acting Chairman of UGC.

The government of Bangladesh appointed Professor Kazi Shahidullah, also a former Vice-Chancellor of National University, Bangladesh, as the new Chairman of UGC for a four-year term. The term of immediate past Chairman of UGC Professor Abdul Mannan ended on 07 May 2019. Then, Professor Dr. Mohammad Yousuf Ali Mollah, senior most Member of UGC, served as its Acting Chairman.

Professor Shahidullah obtained his B.A. (Honours) degree in 1972 and M.A. in 1973 from the Department of History, University of Dhaka securing the first class first position in both the examinations. Subsequently, he pursued higher studies at the University of British Columbia, Canada, where he was awarded M.A. degree in 1979 and the University of Western Australia from where he received the PhD degree in 1984. In both the institutions, he was a recipient of University Graduate Fellowship.

Dr. Shahidullah did his post-doctoral research in the United Kingdom and Australia. At Curtin University, Australia, he taught a course on the History of the Indian Ocean Region in the School of Social and Asian Languages.

He started his teaching career as a Lecturer of History at University of Dhaka in 1976 and became Professor in 1991. During his long teaching career, he held important positions such as Member of Syndicate, Senate, Dean and Departmental Head.

Professor Shahidullah has authored two books titled 'Literacy in Mid-Nineteenth Century Devon and Suffolk' and 'Patshalas into Schools: The Development of Indigenous Elementary Education in Bengal, 1854- 1905'. He has many

research publications in reputed national and international journals to his credit.

Dr. Shahidullah is associated with a number of professional bodies and organisations like Asiatic Society and Bangladesh Itihas Samity for long.

He did both his M.Sc. and PhD in Electrical and Computer Engineering from Portland State University, Oregon, USA, one of the top ranking universities in the world. He joined the Department of Computer Science and Engineering of ULAB as a Professor as well as Head in 2009. He is the key contributor in developing ICT Master Plan for UGC and Secondary and Higher Education Division of Ministry of Education.

Professor Sazzad has substantial research experience in the area of Quantum Computing, Internet of Things, Big Data, Machine Learning and Fourth Industrial Revolution. He has published more than fifty research articles in national and international journals. It may be mentioned that, Professor Sazzad is the first ever PhD awardee in Bangladesh who completed his doctoral research in the field of Quantum Computing. He has long been working for building Digital Bangladesh and creating tech-based network throughout the country.

Professor Alamgir obtained B.Sc. and M.Sc. degrees in Civil Engineering from Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET). He joined in the Department of Civil Engineering at KUET as a Lecturer in 1986 and was elevated to the post of Professor in 2002. His research interest areas cover solid waste and faecal sludge management, geotechnical and geoenvironmental engineering and climate change issues.

A Senior Faculty of the Department of Civil Engineering of Khulna University of Engineering and Technology, Professor Alamgir had served as the Vice-Chancellor of the university for two consecutive terms during 2010-2018. Professor Alamgir visited more than 25 countries for research and professional purposes. He was the Visiting Professor in the Bauhaus University Weimar, Germany and the University of Padova, Italy. He has been organizing an International Conference 'WasteSafe' on solid waste and faecal sludge management in very odd year since 2009.

Dr. Alamgir has more than 240 research publications in reputed national and international journals and conference to his credit. He is associated with a number of professional bodies and other organisations. He was born in a respected Muslim family in Chandpur district on 16 June 1963.

Dhaka University got the highest revenue budgetary allocation of Tk 764.65 crore while Sylhet Medical University got Tk 3.60 crore. Sylhet Medical University, for the first time, has been included in the budgetary allocation. Besides, the meeting approved Tk 50.97 crore for UGC for the 2019-2020 fiscal year.

The meeting also approved the revised budget of Tk 4834.63 crore for the universities and Tk 49.03 crore for UGC for the 2018-2019 fiscal year.

The commission approved Tk 64.40 crore for research support in the 2019-2020 fiscal year. The figure was Tk 62.36 crore in the last fiscal year.

Afghan delegation holds meeting with UGC on HEAT project
